Labour: around 467 thousand hires planned by companies in May and over 1.5 million by July

The difficulty of companies in recruiting concerns 46% of profiles sought

Rome, 5 May 2023 – Around 467 thousand employment contracts (lasting more than one month or permanent contracts) are planned by companies in May and over 1.5 million for the May-July trimester, with an increase of 22 thousand compared to May 2022 (+5.1%) and of 16 thousand on the corresponding quarter (+1.1%). Outlining this scenario is the *Excelsior Information System* bulletin, created by Unioncamere and Anpal¹.

Industry plans 132 thousand entries in May and more than 400 thousand in the May-July trimester, with a growth respectively of 33.1% (+33 thousand contracts) and 24.2% (+78 thousand) compared to last year. In May manufacturing sector is looking for 87 thousand workers, rising to 268 thousand in the quarter.

The greatest job opportunities are offered by mechatronics (22 thousand contracts to be activated in the month and 66 thousand in the quarter), metallurgy (18 thousand in the month and around 53 thousand in the quarter), agri-food (11 thousand in the month and around 45 thousand in the quarter) and fashion (about 11 thousand in the month and 29 thousand in the quarter). The construction sector is also growing, planning 45 thousand hires for the month (+35.9%) and around 132 thousand in the May-July trimester (+25.8%).

Services are looking for around 335 thousand workers in May and over 1.1 million by July, with a decrease respectively of -3.0% (-10 thousand entries) and -5.1% (-62 thousand entries) compared to a year ago. The demand for labour from tourism companies remains very high, planning 107 thousand contracts in the month and 398 thousand by July.

There are also many job opportunities offered by trade with around 58 thousand hires expected in the month and around 192 thousand in the quarter. Next come personal services which, despite the decline recorded compared to a year ago (-27.2%), are looking for around 49 thousand workers in May, rising to over 180 thousand in the May-July trimester.

In May 46.1% of personnel sought by companies is difficult to find (+7.8 p.p. compared to a year ago), mainly due to the lack of candidates.

The figures with a higher incidence of difficulty in recruiting, reported in the Borsino of professions in the Information System Excelsior, are for technical and highly specialized professions engineers and engineering technicians (respectively 61.0% and 65.2%), health technicians (63.1%), production process management technicians (63.0%) and commercial distribution technicians (58.7%); while among the profiles of specialized labourers stand out building finisher specialised labourers (73.5%), smelters, welders, tinsmiths, boilermakers, metal structure fitters (72.2%), artisan mechanics, fitters, repairers, maintenance technicians of stationary/mobile machines (72.1%) and blacksmiths ironworkers and tool makers (71.5%).

The demand for immigrant workers remains high with 91 thousand entries scheduled in the month (+18 thousand compared to the same period in 2022), equal to 19.5% of the total. Sectors most reliant on immigrant personnel are operational support services for businesses and individuals (37.3% of programmed entries will be covered by immigrant workers), transport,

logistics and warehousing services (28.7%), construction (23.9%), metallurgy (23.2%) and food industries (20.3%).

Both the forecast for permanent contracts (+11.9%) and that for fixed-term and seasonal contracts (+5.7%) are on the rise, while are decreasing contracts for collaborators (-18.7%) or VAT (-13.1%).

At territorial level it's highlighted that inflow expected in May in the Northern regions is growing compared to the same month in 2022 (+14 thousand units for the North West and + 18 thousand for the North East), while is observed a negative trend for the Central regions (-2 thousand) and for the South and Islands (-7 thousand hires).



INFLOW OF WORKERS EXPECTED BY COMPANIES BASED ON BUSINESS SECTOR








DIFFICULTY IN RECRUITING AND REASONS (%)






