Labour: 427 thousand hirings expected by companies in November

Positive forecast for tourism and trade, decreasing hiring for manufacturing and construction

Rome, 11 November 2024 – Companies expect more than 427 thousand hires in November 2024 and plan around 1.3 million for the entire November 2024-January 2025 quarter¹. Compared to the previous year, a slight decline is estimated with -3 thousand hirings planned in the month (-0.7%) and -34 thousand hirings planned for the quarter (-2.6%), with differentiated trends depending on the sectors. The difficulty in recruiting reported by companies remains high, involving 47.9% of planned hires. This scenario is outlined by the *Excelsior Information System Bulletin*, created by **Unioncamere** in collaboration **with Ministry of Labour and Social Policies** ².

Driving the demand for work are service companies with around 307 thousand workers wanted in November and 908 thousand in the quarter, marking growth on an annual basis (+2.5% in the month and +0.6% in the quarter). Positive forecats are expected especially for tourism and commerce, sectors which plan 82 thousand and 72 thousand hires respectively. The forecasts of the industry are more uncertain, which is looking for 121 thousand workers in the month and 360 thousand in the quarter, with a decline compared to a year ago (-8.0% compared to November 2023 and -9.9% on the same quarter of 2023). Manufacturing companies expect to hire around 78 thousand workers in the month (-9.9% compared to a year ago) and around 239 thousand in the quarter (-12.5%), while construction companies are looking for over 43 thousand workers in November (-4.3%) and 122 thousand in the quarter (-4.3%).

Fixed-term contracts are confirmed as the most proposed contractual form with 237 thousand units, equal to 55.5% of the total, followed by permanent contracts (82 thousand, 19.2%).

In the month of November there were approximately 205 thousand personnel searches for which companies declared difficulty in finding, equal to 47.9% of the total expected hirings. Companies report the greatest critical issues in the search for profiles to be included in the "Installation, repair" company area (66.8% are difficult to find) followed by the "Design and Research & Development" company areas (57.7%), "Production of goods and provision of services" (52.5%) and "General management, personnel and organization of human resources (51.2%). Among the most difficult professional profiles to find on the market, Borsino Excelsior in the group of intellectual, scientific and specialized professions highlights engineers (58.8% are difficult to find) and analysts and specialists in application design (55.4%). Among the technical professions, the most difficult to find are technicians managing the production processes of goods and services (71.5%), health technicians (62.9%) and technicians in the engineering field (57.9%). Beauty care workers (59.0%) and workers in catering activities (56.0%) are the professions with the highest difficulty in finding for the group of qualified professionals in commercial activities and services. Blacksmiths, tool builders (74.5%) and foundry workers, welders, tinsmiths, boilermakers, metal carpentry assemblers (74.1%) are the most difficult professions to find among specialized workers, while for conductors the workers employed in automatic and semi-automatic machines



for metalworking (67.0%) and workers employed in machinery in the textile and packaging industry (63.2%).

The companies plan to hire 86 thousand immigrant staff in the month of November, equal to 20.1% of the total contracts. Sectors that make most use of foreign labor are: transport, logistics and warehousing services in which the request for immigrant personnel concerns 29.4% of the total contracts envisaged, operational support services for businesses and people (28.3%), accommodation and food services (22.7%), construction (22.2%) and metallurgy (19.7%).


The companies are also looking for 131 thousand young people "under 30" who represent 31% of the entries planned for November. The greatest employment opportunities for young people are offered by financial and insurance services (46.0% of planned hires will be covered by young people), IT and telecommunications services (45.6%), trade (39.9%), media and communication services (38.7%) and the chemical-pharmaceutical, plastic and rubber industries (37.4%). At a territorial level, the demand for labor from companies in the South and Islands is growing (+10 thousand in the month and +25 thousand in the quarter), while in the remaining territorial areas there is a decline both in the month and in the quarter.

INFLOW OF WORKERS EXPECTED BY COMPANIES BASED ON BUSINESS SECTOR (a.v.; %)



INFLOW OF WORKERS EXPECTED BY COMPANIES BY SIZE CLASS (a.v.; %)




INFLOW OF WORKERS FORECAST BY COMPANIES BY CONTRACT TYPE (a.v.; %)



DIFFICULTY IN RECRUITING, MOTIVATIONS AND COMPANY AREAS WITH GREATER DIFFICULTIES (%)




INFLOW OF IMMIGRANT PERSONNEL AND MAIN SECTORS HIRING IMMIGRANT WORKERS (a.v.; %)
