# Labour: 489 thousand hirings expected by companies in October (+3.7%)

The forecasts for services are positive (+8.0%), more uncertain for manufacturing (-2.6%) and construction (-10.6%). 49.3% of workers are difficult to find; one contract in three is aimed at young people under 29

Rome, 16 October 2024 – 489 thousand job opportunities planned by companies in October, with a fixed-term contract lasting more than one month or an indefinite period, 17 thousand more than those planned a year ago (+3.7%). Positive forecasts also for the October-December quarter with around 1.3 million scheduled hires, up compared to the same period in 2023 (+54 thousand; +4.5%). The difficulty in recruiting reported by companies remains high, involving 49.3% of planned hires, substantially in line with 12 months ago. This scenario is outlined by the *Excelsior Information System Bulletin*, created by **Unioncamere** in collaboration with Ministry of Labour and Social Policies <sup>1</sup>.

"The difficulty in recruiting remains constant at a high level for companies - stress the President of Unioncamere, Andrea Prete - which in one case out of two take too long to find the professionals they need. We must set up the training system in order to solve the problem at least in the medium term considering that the birth rate decline is a well-known fact in our country, and it will be difficult to reverse the trend. A far-sighted policy in the management of migratory flows will also have to take these problems into account".

At a sector level, the industry as a whole plans 141 thousand hirings in the month (-8 thousand entries compared to a year ago; -5.6%) and 349 thousand hirings in the October-December quarter (-16 thousand entries; -4.4%). In October, manufacturing companies are looking for around 91 thousand workers (-2.7% compared to the same period in 2023) which rises to 225 thousand for the entire October-December quarter (-8 thousand income; -3.4%). Construction companies plan over 50 thousand hires for October (-10.6% on the year) and 124 thousand for the quarter (-6.2%). The hiring forecasts for service companies are positive with growth compared to a year ago of 8% in the same month of 2023 (+26 thousand contracts) and 8.4% in the October-November 2023 quarter (+70 thousand contracts). Tourism offers the greatest job opportunities with 90 thousand requests in the month and 245 thousand in the quarter and trade with 79 thousand workers in the month and 207 thousand in the quarter. This is followed by services for people looking for over 62 thousand workers in the month and 152 thousand in the quarter.

In October there was a decline in the demand for work for micro-enterprises (-1.3 thousand entries, -0.9%), the forecasts for those with more than 10 employees were positive (+19 thousand, +5.9%). In the October-December quarter, growth expectations concern all size ranges. Fixed-term contracts are confirmed as the most proposed contractual form with 276 thousand units, equal to 56.4% of the total, followed by permanent contracts (94 thousand).

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

The difficulty in recruiting, which overall concerns 49.3% of personnel searches, reaches peaks of 66.2% for specialized workers and 52.4% for technical professions. The Excelsior Professions Register highlights among the most difficult figures to find among specialized workers: foundries, welders, tinsmiths, boilermakers, metal carpentry assemblers (79.0% are difficult to find) and blacksmiths, toolmakers (76.8 %); for technical professions, engineering technicians (65.5%) and healthcare technicians (59.5%) are particularly difficult to find.

The companies plan to hire 96 thousand immigrant staff in the month of October, equal to 19.6% of the total contracts. Among the sectors that make greatest use of foreign labor are: operational support services for businesses and people (30.2% of the expected entries will be covered by immigrant personnel), transport, logistics and warehousing services (28.5%), accommodation and catering services (23.2% %), metallurgy (21.6%) and construction (21.5%).


32% of the hirings planned by companies in October are aimed at young people "under 30" for a total of approximately 157 thousand positions reserved for them. The greatest employment opportunities for young people are offered by financial and insurance services (48.6% of planned hires will be covered by young people), IT and telecommunications services (45.9%), trade (40.5%), accommodation and catering services (40.2%) and the chemical-pharmaceutical, plastic and rubber industries (39.4%). At a territorial level, the demand for labor from companies in the South and Islands is growing (+25 thousand in the month and +69 thousand in the quarter). The demand for labor from companies in the Center is almost stable (-410 hirings in the month and +1.9 thousand in the quarter), while there is a decline for companies in the North west (-4 thousand in the month and -6 thousand in the quarter) and in the North est (-3 thousand in the month and -11 thousand in the quarter).

#### INFLOW OF WORKERS EXPECTED BY COMPANIES BASED ON BUSINESS SECTOR (a.v.; %)



#### INFLOW OF WORKERS EXPECTED BY COMPANIES BY SIZE CLASS (a.v.; %)




### INFLOW OF WORKERS FORECAST BY COMPANIES BY CONTRACT TYPE (a.v.; %)






### INFLOW OF IMMIGRANT PERSONNEL AND MAIN SECTORS HIRING IMMIGRANT WORKERS (a.v.; %)
