# Labour: over 447 thousand hirings expected by companies in March The forecasts are positive for tourism, trade and personal services and construction; manufacturing is decreasing

Rome, 18 March 2024 – There are over 447 thousand contracts planned by companies in the month of March and around 1.4 million are expected for the March-May quarter, with an increase of almost 30 thousand units compared to March 2023 (+7.1%) and around 112 thousand units on the same quarter of 2023 (+8.7%). The forecasts in the service sectors are growing (+10.5% in the month and +11.4% in the quarter), thanks in particular to the expected trends in tourism (+16% in the month and +14.3% in the quarter) and trade (+14.6% in the month and +17.2% in the quarter). The flows planned by construction companies are positive (+2.7% compared to March 2023 and +7.4% compared to the corresponding quarter) although a decrease of 1.5% compared to February 2024 should be noted. Manufacturing companies in March report a contraction in hiring compared to the same month of 2023 (-1.6%) and timid signs of growth in the quarter (+0.2%). This scenario is outlined by the Excelsior Information System Bulletin, created by **Unioncamere** in collaboration with **Ministry of Labour and Social Policies**<sup>1</sup>.

Among the manufacturing sectors, which overall are looking for over 85 thousand workers in the month and 249 thousand in the quarter, the greatest job opportunities concern the mechatronics industries with around 23 thousand workers in the month and 66 thousand in the quarter, followed by the metallurgical industries (18 thousand and just over 50 thousand) and food (11 thousand and 33 thousand). There are 49 thousand hiring expected by companies in construction in March and 146 thousand until May. In the tertiary sector, there are approximately 313 thousand employment contracts that companies intend to activate in March and over 992 thousand those expected in the March-May quarter. Tourism is offering the greatest employment opportunities with around 82 thousand workers sought in the month and 299 thousand in the quarter, followed by trade (65 thousand and 194 thousand entries respectively) and personal services<sup>2</sup> (49 thousand and 154 thousand).

The difficulty in recruiting is still high, although slightly down compared to February, equal to 47.8% of the total, especially due to the lack of candidates to fill the open job positions. The most difficult profiles to find in the job market concern specialized workers (64.6%), plant operators (54.3%) and technicians (54.2%).

The hirings that companies expect to fill using immigrants concern 85 thousand units (equal to 19.1% of total revenue), with an increase of 8.5% compared to what was expected in March 2023. Companies that intend to make greater use of foreign labor are those of sectors of operational support services to businesses and people (33.7%), transport - logistics (28.4%) and construction (25.2%).





Also in March, the flow of hiring is characterized by a prevalence of fixed-term contracts (239 units; 53.4% of the total), followed by permanent contracts (91 thousand; 20.4%) and temporary contracts (41 thousand; 9.2%).


At a territorial level, it is worth underlining the high mismatch found by companies in the North East, which means that around 52.9% of the profiles sought are difficult to find, with peaks of 57.1% for Friuli-Venezia Giulia. Companies in the North West report difficulties in finding 47.9% of the profiles sought, followed by companies in the Center (45.9%) and those in Southern Italy (44.5%).


### INFLOW OF WORKERS FORECAST BY COMPANIES BY CONTRACT TYPE (a.v.; %)






**DIFFICULTY IN RECRUITING AND REASONS (%)**
